Community Survey

We are looking at ways to make our school a better place for learning for all students. We are trying to build a culture that respects and builds all people, welcomes them for who they are, builds relationships and is responsive to the cultures of all those involved. When students are valued, feel valued and secure, learning is easier. Our school is working with leaders from the University of Waikato to lead us through this with an emphasis on seeing if we are meeting the needs of our Maori students. If we can learn to get it right for our Maori students, we can also learn to be culturally responsive for all students. The first step in this process is to determine where we are at now and what our current practices are. To do this we are conducting a number of surveys - of students, staff, parents and the community, to collect baseline data. This survey - Rongohia te Hau - will help identify where we are and what we will need to focus on in the next year. This is an online survey with the link below:
